Regular communication with parents ensures collaborative support and a positive feedback loop that reinforces learning and motivates the child.

Teaching Literacy and Numeracy

We integrate modern, research-based approaches into our curriculum, such as the Singapore Math method and Letterland phonics, to provide children with a strong foundation in literacy and numeracy. We alternate these lessons, incorporating inquiry-based learning and multi-sensory experiences to ensure deep understanding and engagement.





Learning Environment

Our dynamic and adaptive learning spaces are designed to spark curiosity and encourage exploration. Designated learning corners foster specific skills, while flexible furniture arrangements support various learning modes. We showcase children's work and integrate interactive elements to create a vibrant and inspiring environment.

Use of Technology

We leverage technology to enhance communication and personalise learning. Our Parent app provides real-time updates and facilitates seamless communication between parents and teachers. HoloTracker allows for detailed observations and data collection, informing each child's ILP and ensuring a responsive educational experience.

Cognition

Do you have a bilingual programme?

We do not offer a bilingual programme at present. Our Chinese-speaking members of staff speak in Mandarin when engaging with the children in the play and activity spaces, which exposes and familiarises them to the language.

How do you train your teachers?

We keep all staff up to date on best care and educational practices, including curriculum development and child safety management through a combination of the Agora Training Plan and third-party programmes.

How do you help children with their social and emotional development?

Our programme is founded with holistic development as a focus. Learning how to build and maintain connections with others is one of the more important aspects of growing into a successful young adult. We help children navigate the process as well as create the space for them to develop social and emotional capabilities, that we then seek to observe and reinforce.



Learning Environment

What is the teacher-to-child ratio in your classrooms?

We prioritise individualised attention and small group interactions to ensure each child receives the support they need to thrive. Our teacher-to-child ratios are carefully maintained to foster optimal learning and engagement. We maintain a ratio of 1:6, and 1:8 respectively in grades PG and N1, allowing for close supervision and personalised interactions. For grades N2 through K2, the ratio increases from 1:10 to 1:12, and 1:15, ensuring a balance between individual attention and opportunities for collaborative learning.

How do you ensure the safety and security of children in your facilities?

The safety and security of our children are of paramount importance at Agora. Our centre is designed with child safety in mind, featuring secure access points, age-appropriate equipment, and well-maintained facilities. We have strict protocols for drop-off and pick-up, ensuring that children are only released to authorised individuals. Additionally, our staff members are trained in first aid and emergency procedures to respond promptly and effectively to any situation.

What kind of outdoor spaces do you have available for children to explore and play?

We believe in the importance of outdoor play and exploration for children's holistic development. Our centre features a wonderful outdoor terrace facing the sea, featuring a playground, sand- and water play features, and shaded areas, where children can engage in active play, connect with nature, and develop gross motor skills. We also utilise our outdoor spaces for learning activities, allowing children to experience the world around them and apply their knowledge in real-world contexts.



Practical matters

Are your teachers first aid trained?

We have Child First Aiders on site at all times as required by regulations.

Do you provide food and snacks?

Yes, we provide a morning snack after our Core Music and Movement time. It offers a natural break time for the children and gives them energy for the next round of activities. We seek to ensure that all snacks are healthy. Please remember to provide us with information regarding allergies during registration.

How do you clean, and how often do you clean equipment and resources?

All of our equipment is cleaned after usage in accordance with ECDA standards. At the end of each session, it is cleaned and wiped down with disinfectant. We put any resources that have been in children's mouths during the session aside, so that they won't be played with until they have been sanitised.

How do you verify who is allowed to pick up my child?

Authorised persons must be listed in the registration form and introduced to the Head of Early Years and teachers, in person if possible, otherwise by sharing photographs.

What happens if I am running late?

Your child will remain safe under the supervision of Early Years staff. Agora Colearning opens every weekday until 8pm.

Other questions

Can you accommodate children with special needs?

Yes, we can accommodate certain mild or moderate disabilities. Claire Michael, the Head of Early Years, is an ECDA-certified Inclusion Officer (ICO), and our



programme is flexible to individual needs. To ensure that we are able to offer suitable support, we recommend a trial period to evaluate and discuss options.
